# EAST COWES SAILING CLUB Commadores Report AGM 2022

### Where the club was when the present committee took over in 2021.

- There was no handover whatsoever from the previous Commodore he in fact cleared his dinghy and possessions under the cover of night never to be seen again.
- It soon became apparent that although the Club was functioning there was no Health and Safety policies within the club. For example:
  - 1. Fire Panel never tested.
  - 2. Emergency lighting never tested.
  - 3. General maintenance ignored leaving structures dangerous.
  - 4. Finger pontoons Rotting.
  - 5. Wall to slipway failing causing the cradle to become stuckgiving the potential for a boat to work free of the cradle.
  - 6. Fuel store never checked Eric Caws was the last to check he passed away in 2017.
  - 7. No site plans for Emergency services.
  - 8. No asbestos policy.
  - 9. The Toilet block windows were falling out.
  - 10.A report on the centre store was compiled by an architect in 2016 as it was noticed that the steels were corroding where the steel supports meet the concrete base

Their findings and recommendations were that the Steels needed urgent attention. Until these works were carried out do not! Put any additional loading on the first floor.

Do not Adjust or change the roof trusses.

Do not cut away any of the floor as it formed part of the structural integrity of the building.

This was completely ignored an industrial sized kitchen was installed along with gas boiler, stud walls were built roof trusses altered and floor cut away to instal another staircase.

Some 18 to 23 thousand pounds was spent not taking into account the amount of man hours given by members that the club in return pay £7.50 per hour for, so the total cast was colossal.
